## HOW CAN YOUR FEDERAL AGENCY WORK WITH ARGONNE?

Argonne can work with your federal agency to address technical issues and help you meet your program goals.

Under various statutes, international agreements, and common federal policies, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) has a mission to provide technical assistance to other federal agencies.

The DOE laboratories and technology centers have developed world-class core technical capabilities in a variety of technologies, and they are uniquely qualified to provide immediate research and development support to other federal agencies.

The primary mechanism through which Argonne works with federal agencies is a Strategic Partnership Project (SPP).

## Strategic Partnership Project

An SPP is a contract that enables your federal agency to pay the laboratory to perform a defined scope of work with tasks that draw upon the unique facilities, equipment and personnel of the laboratory. With certain DOE approvals, the sponsor may obtain ownership of both inventions and data generated under an SPP.

When it comes to SPPs, Argonne has experience working with various forms of interagency agreements throughout the fed complex, including military interagency purchase requests (MIPR) and interagency agreements (IA).
